Dog theft is on the rise and we are urging the public to keep their dogs SECURE, IN SIGHT and SEARCHABLE, and to help make pet theft a SPECIFIC OFFENCE.

Keep them:

- **1. SECURE** (pets are easily stolen from unsecured gardens if left unattended)
- **2. IN SIGHT** (when out and about keep them close and practice good recall)
- **3. SEARCHABLE** (to support quicker recovery if they go missing keep them microchipped, tagged and up to date photos)

The webinar will be led by Neighbourhood Watch Network with speakers from the Met Police and Crimestoppers, as well as special guest speaker Katy Bourne, PCC for Sussex.

About guest speaker Katy Bourne, PCC for Sussex

Katy Bourne is in her third term as Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) for Sussex. She was first elected in 2012, re-elected in 2016 and again in 2021. The PCC's role is to hold the Chief Constable to account for the performance of the Force; effectively making the police answerable to the communities they serve.

Katy is responsible for setting the strategic direction and priorities for Sussex Police through the Police & Crime Plan. This includes setting the police budget and local police precept – the amount residents pay for policing in their council tax. She also has a statutory duty to deliver community safety initiatives including Restorative Justice and crime reduction grants, along with commissioning support services for victims of crime.

Her genuine passion and commitment to making a difference has won her praise from successive Home Secretaries and Prime Ministers and in June 2019 she was awarded an OBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours.

Help make pet theft a specific criminal offence

We are asking our supporters, for the first time, to lobby for a change in the law to help make pet theft a SPECIFIC CRIMINAL OFFENCE.

At present, dog theft is not defined as a specific crime, with dogs classed as 'property' under the Theft Act 1968. If caught, the penalty for stealing pets is generally a small fine or suspended sentence, with the Pet Theft Reform campaign reporting that in recent years only 1% of dog theft crimes have led to a prosecution.

At the moment many police forces are unable to distinguish between theft of a dog and theft of other property therefore the true extent of dog theft cannot be understood.

You can campaign by signing a petition (closing on 20th May) or writing to your MP.

Fit a bell or gate alarm to any rear or side gates; the gates should be secured with British Standard locks, locking bolts or closed shackle padlocks.
